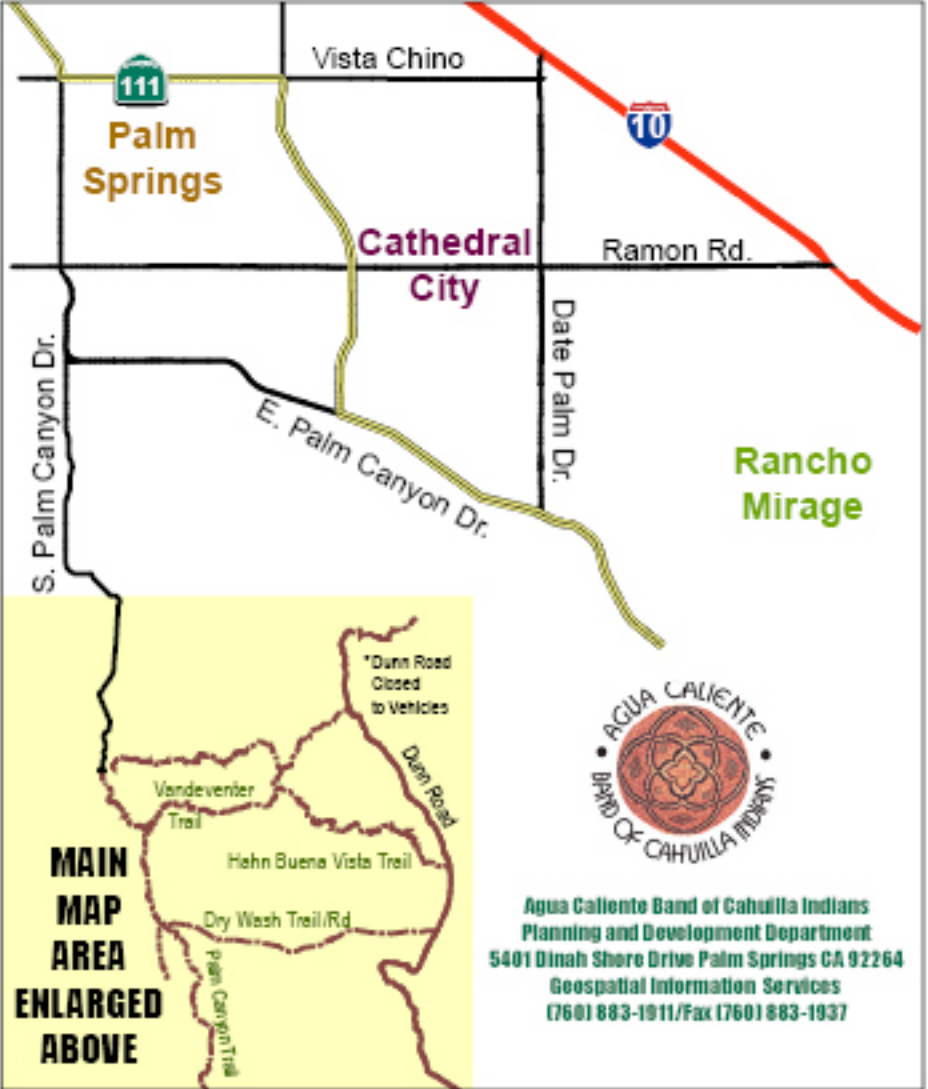
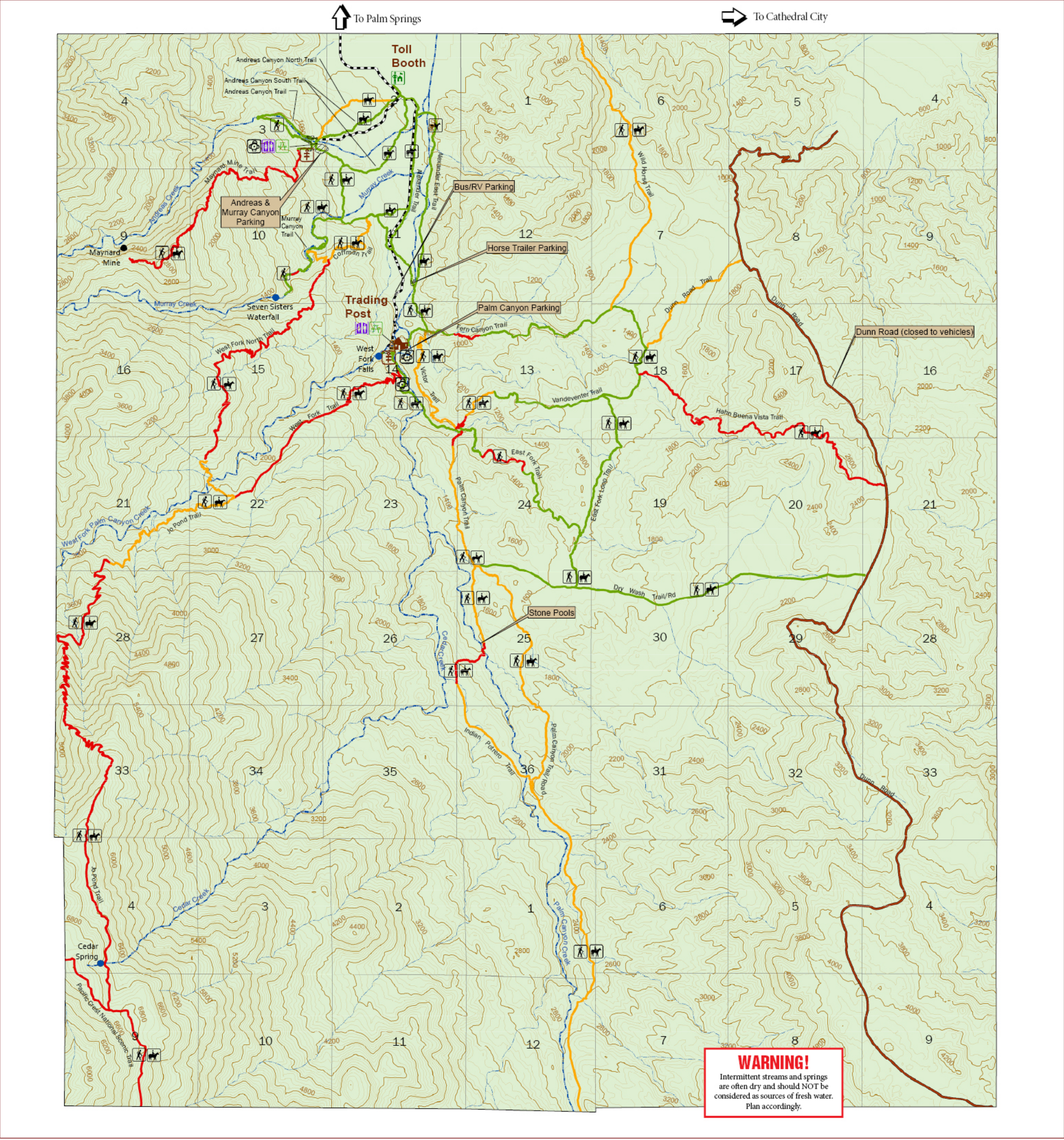

The Santa Rosa and San Jacinto Mountains National Monument (SSJM National Monument) was designated by Congress in 2000. The Monument encompasses 272,000 acres and embraces a dramatic landscape rising from sea level near Palm Springs to the 10,800-foot San Jacinto Peak. It includes Indian Canyons, the largest system of native fan palms in the U.S., owned and managed by the Agua Caliente Band of Cahuilla Indians. The National Monument is managed by the Bureau of Land Management (BLM), the U.S. Forest Service (USFS), and in consultation and cooperation with the Agua Caliente Band of Cahuilla Indians (ACBI), other federal agencies, state agencies, and local government to protect the National Monument's biological, cultural, recreational, geological, educational, scientific, and scenic values.

(NOTE: Each Township Section is 1 mile square.)
